To Residents and Resident Family Members of Licensed Areas:

Here is your weekly update on employee and resident testing. As I have mentioned in past correspondence, having a positive resident or employee in any licensed area, per CDC guidelines, requires “repeat testing of all previously negative HCP (healthcare personnel), generally between 3 days to 7 days, until testing identifies no new cases of COVID-19 infection among residents or HCP for a period of at least 14 days since the most recent positive result.” To date we have tested residents and employees three weeks straight. Tests performed this past Monday, July 27, on all residents residing in the Broad Skilled Nursing Neighborhood were found to be negative for COVID-19. Then on Tuesday, July 28, tests performed on 62 employees were negative except for three positive employees. One employee is full time and the other two are part time. Not all employees tested had direct contact or exposure to those residents living in the Broad Neighborhood. .

**We will be testing only those residents living in the Broad Neighborhood this coming Monday, August 3, 2020. The Broad Neighborhood is one of our three Skilled Nursing Neighborhoods.**

These are the precautions we are currently taking in specific Skilled Nursing Neighborhoods. If another Neighborhood has a positive case of COVID-19, these precautions will be implemented in that Neighborhood as well:

- Every resident in Broad has been placed on droplet isolation precautions. Droplet isolation precautions will be discontinued when we negative results for both employee and resident for 14 consecutive days. .
- All staff working in Broad are required to stay on his/her assigned Neighborhood throughout his/her shift. Food will be delivered to the Neighborhood.
- All staff in the Jane Bruce Neighborhoods (Broad, Congaree, and Saluda) are required to wear a face shield in addition to their mask.
  - Face shields and KN95 masks are offered to any team member working in the Jane Bruce Neighborhoods and to anyone else requesting them.
- We are requiring all staff throw away their medical masks at the end of each day/shift before getting into their vehicles.
- We are placing an even stronger emphasis on social distancing with residents and proper mask wearing.
- All staff is required to check his/her temperature at the end of the shift in addition to before the shift begins.
