Gardening at Still Hopes: November

Chilly mornings and brilliant shades of red and yellow tree leaves tell us it must be Fall. As the season prescribes, the Still Hopes Grounds Crew has been busily planting cool season annuals and replacing some shrubbery. Shedded leaves are returning precious nutrients to the soil. Hollies are fruiting, some Camellia sasanquas are flowering, and ornamental grasses' feathery plumes are dancing.

Raised bed gardening. Recently seven Still Hopes residents took advantage of the raised beds located alongside Rose Gardens. Straddling the growing

seasons, the Shaw/McDonald bed is modeled after a French kitchen garden in which flowers and vegetables are typically planted together. Colorful yellow marigolds and white vinca excite the eye while cool season vegetables and herbs, e.g. lettuce, parsley, chives, basil and radishes, are thriving. If you look closely

you may be able to see welcomed Black Swallowtail Butterfly caterpillars munching on the curly-leaf parsley. Before too long a hard frost will put an end to the annuals; the vegetables and herbs will continue, however.

Birds in our forest. Did you know that the SH Forest is an ideal stopover for many migrating birds? Among them are Yellow Shafted Northern Flickers that travel from Canada down the Atlantic coast to spend winters here. Their habitat is an open forest where they feed on ants, beetles and other insects. Listen to their calls at

audubon.org and look for them while you're out walking.
