

Afternoons with Andy Armstrong A NEW CHAMBER MUSIC SERIES AT STILL HOPES



The Biggest Little Farm & The Biggest Little Farm-The Return



CREATIVE CIRCLE AND COFFEE (C3) ART SHOW

AT STILL HOPES | FEBRUARY & MARCH

The show scheduled in the hall art gallery next to Emilie's Café during the months of February and March will be the responsibility of a group new to Still Hopes. The group calls itself Creative Circle and Coffee (C3) because they study creativity and meet every Monday, discussing creativity and sipping coffee at a local coffee shop. All of the 6 women members are of varying levels of experience as artists and of varying ages but share a common interest and love of art. The group initially was created out of an effort at Trinity Cathedral to increase church participation post Covid. A group of 12 women met monthly for various art experiences while a smaller group of the same interested women met to begin a book study of creativity. This smaller group has evolved into the Creative Circle and Coffee (otherwise shortened to C3). This group believes that the human individual is created by God and that each person has an innate creative spark which when ignited can lead him/her into

an experience of discovery that only needs to be accepted and acknowledged.

The group has studied various books about the creative process as well as has participated in several plein air painting sessions, artistic field trips, informal at-home gatherings, and attended several professional shows. Being together on this pilgrimage improved their understanding and appreciation of their talents and positively impacted the development and quality of their art as well as enhanced each member's spiritual growth. Additionally, the journey has created life long bonds of friendship and has greatly deepened each individual's feeling of closeness with the ultimate Creator – God. Gardening at Still Hopes: January

Do you think all the birds have migrated to warmer climates? Not so. There are many species of birds that inhabit our Forest year-round and regularly visit our feeders. We can still observe and hear them as they move about their familiar habitat in search for food, water and shelter. On a recent walk through the Forest



12 different bird species songs were recorded by my Merlin app (Cornell Lab of Ornithology), including Red Shoulder Hawk, Ruby-crowned Kinglet, and Carolina Chickadee. Among the most distinctively marked are several woodpecker species that can be seen easily and heard this time of year when the trees are bare. Look for the small

Downy Woodpecker, only 6.75" in length, and the larger Red-Bellied Woodpecker, as it clambers up and down tree trunks searching for insects.

There are many seed-eating birds distinguished by their short, hard pointed beaks that overwinter here. A favorite Northern Cardinal (aka "red bird") is plentiful year round. They are frequent visitors at



our feeders, where they can find their favorite sunflower seeds to supplement grass seeds and fruits of woody plants. Beautyberry shrubs, for example, still hold their purple fruit for the taking. House finches, identified by their pinkish coloration, are also regular visitors to bird feeders. Another common seedeating bird seen here is the Darkeyed Junko, characterized by it dark gray head

Have you noticed the numerous bird feeders along the Sanders Rehab Center, i.e. one at each ground-floor window facing the courtyard and Still Hopes Drive? They are there expressly for the amusement and entertainment of resident patients. It's bird TV. The feeders are faithfully maintained by volunteers Barbara and Joe Carter, Jim Smith, and Jan Cambre and supported by Life Engagement as part of the resident enrichment mission of Still Hopes.

The feeders attract flocks of common House Sparrows, one of six sparrow varieties that overwinter here. They are active little birds, flitting here and there and chattering noisily all the while. When not eating or squabbling over territory, the birds roost in the nearby Crape Myrtles and a large holly near the Greenway entrance or shelter in the foundation shrubs.

House Sparrows are widely spread everywhere there are concentrations of people in the US and Southern Canada. They are notorious scavengers around outdoor cafes and picnic spots. Nearby, for example, they can be seen hoping for a scrap of bread at the Gourmet Restaurant sidewalk café in Five Points. At Still Hopes the sparrows enjoy a favored status in exchange for the fleeting diversion and enjoyment they provide to our residents.


