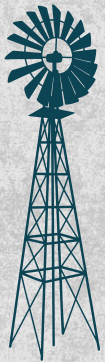

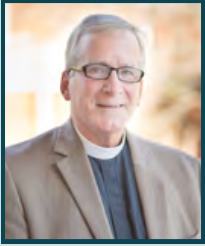

The Danny Sanford Still Hopes Innovation Fund

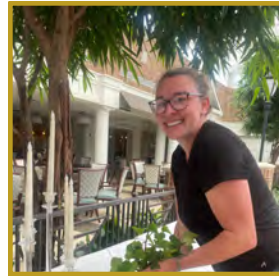

CATCH ME IF YOU CAN RECAP

For nine weeks the residents and employees of Still Hopes, Bishop Gadsden, and The Woodlands at Furman have dedicated their time to collect miles for our third Catch Me If You Can Mileage Challenge. Still Hopes and Bishop Gadsden welcomed a third community to the competition, The Woodlands at Furman, which was a great addition to the competition. All three communities had a combined total of 82,709 miles, a little more than three times around the circumference of the Earth.

In the 2025 Catch Me If You Can Mileage Challenge, Still Hopes brought back home the victory with 35,157 miles! In second place we had Bishop Gadsden, and third place went to The Woodlands at Furman. Each community did an amazing job challenging their residents and employees to get out and increase their intentional exercise.
