ANNE HARRELL AND THE GREAT INTERWEAVE

The interweave of relationships that Still Hopes residents have with one another reveals itself constantly. Many people know each other from prior schools, neighborhoods, civic associations, personal and professional lives. "I went to school with her". "He was my doctor for many years". "My son married his daughter". "He was the best Sunday School teacher my son ever had". This all spins a lovely web of inter-relationships, shared memories and local pride.

One resident who epitomizes this well is Anne Turner Harrell. Born in Winnsboro, South Carolina, she attended Columbia College in the 1950's, majoring in History. To this day, she values the excellent education she received there. Columbia College has produced a number of Still Hopes residents and some of them have been on the faculty there as well. After graduation, Anne taught English and Social Studies at the middle school level and at least one of her former students is a now a neighbor. She raised two children and maintains, her keen interest in world events, politics and government.

While working at Columbia College, Anne met Flynn Harrell who was then beginning his remarkable career. In addition to many civic, governmental, and church voluntary positions, Flynn served as CFO of the South Carolina Baptist



Convention and Executive Assistant to the state's Attorney General. Anne describes Flynn as openminded and ahead of his times in many ways. A champion of both Church and State, he knew that keeping them separate was a gift to each, and that became an area he concentrated on. One highlight of his work led to an invitation to the White House when Jimmy Carter was President. Carter had however just lost re-election and was literally negotiating the release of the Iranian hostages the day the Harrells visited, so he was not able to meet with them. (continued on page 11)

But Anne still glows recalling the specialness of such a visit.

Flynn and Anne moved to Still Hopes in the summer of 2005. Flynn passed away in 2021. Recently, Anne has moved from Independent Living to Assisted Living. She knew she would miss her friends on the fifth floor of building six but agreed with her son and daughter that she needed an extra level of support. Anne has made a good adjustment and admits she's better off with more staff around to help her. She loves the River Banks activities and the dining room-and has made friends there.


While making her move to River Banks, Anne unearthed her college yearbooks. She was pleased to learn of a project managed by the Richland County Library on Assembly Street of collecting old yearbooks from Midlands junior and senior high schools and colleges. The yearbooks are available to library users. Donors can give yearbooks to the library to keep, or loan them to the library who will scan and return them. Resident Fran Wheeler has more information about this valuable historical project.

Like Ann Harrell discovered, the Great Interweave is not exclusionary. As a newcomer myself to 'these parts', I have only felt warmth and welcome at Still Hopes. So perhaps we should think of the Great Interweave not as a closed system, but as an alive, ever-evolving web of relationships, valuing the old but open to the new.


