

ABOUT ANDY ARMSTRONG

Praised by critics for his passionate expression and dazzling technique, pianist Andrew Armstrong has delighted audiences across Asia, Europe, Latin America, Canada, and the United States, including performances at Alice Tully Hall, Carnegie Hall, the Kennedy Center, London's Wigmore Hall, Prague's Rudolfinum, the Grand Hall of the Moscow Conservatory, and Warsaw's National Philharmonic. Andrew's orchestral engagements across the globe have encompassed a vast repertoire of more than 60 concertos with orchestra. He has performed with such conductors as Peter Oundjian, Itzhak Perlman, Günther Herbig, Stefan Sanderling, Jean-Marie Zeitouni, and Stanislaw Skrowaczewski, and has appeared in solo recitals and in chamber music concerts with the Ehnes, Elias, Alexander, American, and Manhattan String Quartets, and as a member of the Caramoor Virtuosi, Boston Chamber Music Society, Seattle Chamber Music Society, and the Jupiter Symphony Chamber Players. Recent and upcoming seasons find Andy continuing to perform as soloist and chamber musician around the globe, from London to Geneva and Dresden, from Australia to Hong Kong and Singapore, across Canada and the United States, while continuing to build and grow the flourishing chamber music series he directs in Beaufort and Columbia, SC and in New Canaan, CT.




Injustice In Focus: The Civil Rights Photography of Cecil Williams Presented by Cecil Williams and Claudia Smith Brinson

Thursday, February 1 | 3:00 p.m. Keenan Event Center



Join photographer Cecil Williams and author Claudia Smith Brinson for a discussion on the history of civil rights in South Carolina and their new book *Injustice in Focus: The Civil Rights Photography of Cecil Williams*. Cecil Williams is one of the few Southern Black photojournalists of the civil rights movement. Born and raised in Orangeburg, South Carolina, Williams worked at the center of emerging twentieth-century civil rights activism in the state, and his assignments often exposed him to violence perpetrated by White law officials and ordinary

citizens. Williams's story is the story of the civil rights era. Williams and award-winning journalist Claudia Smith Brinson combine forces in *Injustice in Focus: The Civil Rights Photography of Cecil Williams.*



Together they document civil rights activism in the 1940s through the 1960s in South Carolina. Williams was there, in South Carolina, to witness and document pivotal movements such as then-NAACP legal counsel Thurgood Marshall's arrival in Charleston to argue the landmark case Briggs v. Elliott and the aftermath of the infamous Orangeburg Massacre. Featuring eighty stunning photographs accompanied by Brinson's rich research, interviews, and prose, *Injustice in Focus* offers a firsthand

account of South Carolina's fight for civil rights and describes Williams's life behind the camera as a documentarian of the civil rights movement.

The Resident Assistance Fund enables residents who outlive their resources through no fault of their own to remain here at Still Hopes. The Employee Assistance and Chaplain's Discretionary Funds aide employees in financial need with zerointerest, short-term loans and critical assistance. In 2022, forty-five employees weathered periods of financial crisis with help for housing (rent/mortgage payment), car repairs and payments, and medical bills.

When the Bishop Calls by Judy Milone

When the Bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Upper South Carolina called and asked if he could make a visit to her home, Eleanor Whitehead did what most of us would do - say yes, brew some coffee and wonder what he wanted. When he then presented her with the Cuthbert Cross, a prized

form of recognition from the Diocese for her decades of work in Haiti, she was both surprised and humbled.

The Cuthbert Cross honors persons who have served "with distinction, vision, energy and commitment." In November 2023, at the 101st Diocesan Convention, the Rt. Rev. Daniel Richards announced two such awards, one to our very own Eleanor, highlighting the decades she spearheaded the Diocese's mission work in Haiti. Initially spurred on by a presentation Eleanor heard by the Society of St. Margaret, an Episcopal order of nuns then active in that country, her first efforts began in the 1970's in a parish in Virginia. Later moving to South Carolina, she was pleased to receive the blessing of her new Diocese and Bishop, who felt strongly that Americans need to learn by expanding our horizons in service. While the work has had its ups and downs over the decades, an enormous amount of God's love has been poured into numerous life-giving projects. Money, labor, supplies and prayers have been provided to support educational, literacy, medical, agricultural and scholarship programs. [Engineers from Greenville actually devised a water-carrying system that could be used in the rugged terrain.] Eleanor's work oversaw and supported many of these initiatives, making multiple trips to Haiti, a country with little infrastructure and unique challenges. Despite extreme poverty, serious political upheavals, earthquakes, Covid and other diseases, many of these endeavors exist today.

Born in Montgomery, Alabama, Eleanor was raised there and in Pensacola, Florida. She obtained her RN credentials from Reynolds Community College and, while raising two children, worked primarily in the areas of oncology, hospice and medical administration. Philip and Eleanor have been married for 63 years, have lived in a number of states and are more than pleased to now call Still Hopes home. "It's been a place beyond our hopes," she says.

Warmly known for the Still Hopes film series the couple led for many years, Eleanor's other church activities have included serving on the Committee for Ministry and the Network for Clergy Spouses and Couples.

Eleanor proudly wears the Cuthbert Cross, but with her usual understatedness and poise. Her biggest thrill was "being honored unexpectedly for doing exactly what makes me happiest," she says. And we say: job well done!
